- 3. Principal's Report: Open house this Thursday, September 16, for pk grade 4. Ice cream by PTO at the end of evening. Middle school open house on Tuesday, Sept 28 - trying a new format based on feedback. More of a panel format with slides about expectations. Ice cream will be provided by the PTO at the end of evening. The school has new photographers this year. School photos will be in September. Field trips and visitors are on a limited hold for now. Some programs can happen i.e., out of doors or a presenter coming into a classroom or cohort such as middle school. Eastford CARES program is new and grant funded. This grant will provide after school programs which are free. Some of the programs are as follows; access to homework assistance, wellness, and enrichment and board games. Rebekah Budd is the long term sub for art. There are many transportation issues in other schools, which is not an issue for us at this time because we only have 2 busses. A robocall system is used for notifications in the event that there is a bus issue and families need to be notified. A piece of our playground equipment was damaged over the summer, the wave. This is being looked into as to how to have it removed and what to replace it with, if anything.
