Homebound Instruction

When students are able to benefit from homebound instruction, it shall be provided at home or in a hospital or other health setting as necessary within two weeks of a student's first absence under one or more of the following conditions which are expected to cause student absence from regular instruction for a period of three or more school weeks under the following terms:

1. Recommendation(s) of the Planning and Placement Team either as the student's entire program or as a supplement to his/her regular school program.
2. A physician recommendation report indicates that the student is unable to attend school for medical reasons.
3. The student has a handicap that prevents him/her from learning in a school setting, or his/her presence in school constitutes a hazard to his/her or other students' safety and welfare.
4. A student is pregnant or in a postpartum period. When a student is pregnant or has given birth, the Planning and Placement Team should consult her physician to determine when and for how long home instruction is in the best interest of the student.
5. Parents or guardians are unwilling to accept a special education program offered and homebound instruction is the most satisfactory and economically feasible alternative.

Students receiving homebound instruction shall be provided with appropriate academic and/or special education services in accordance with individual needs.
